There are no more ALPaCas in Corrections.







Aztec's 100-Hour Reentry Prerelease Program

- 10 Booklets/Units
- Total of 100 Proxy Contact Hours
- Can be used just like a packet
- Students receive one booklet per week.
- Each booklet has a different hour value





Basic Rules

- Students receive one HSE ITC booklet per week.
- Each week, when a booklet is returned, the instructor reviews and grades the booklet alongside the student.
- If the student receives a grade of less than 70%, give him a fresh copy of the booklet to complete for the following week. No instructional hours can be recorded for booklets that do not receive a grade of 70% or better.
- If the student receives a grade of 70% or better, record 10 hours of instruction and give him the next booklet in the series.



More Basic Rules

- Retain all the original completed and graded booklets for review by NCCC System Office Compliance Examiners. If the student would like a copy of his work, offer him a photocopy of his completed booklet.
- The 10 proxy hours includes all time the student spends working with an instructor. Student instructional time for HSE ITC may not be recorded on a separate contract or sign-in sheet.
- Students may only complete one HSE ITC booklet per week.
- HSE ITC cannot be run as a membership hour course. It may only be run as a proxy hour course under BSP 2000.

No Rosetta Stone software is approved for use as distance ed software in NC.


