Immigration's Impact on NC Workforce:

- Immigrants are primarily in their prime working years.
- They increase the size of the workforce.
- Immigration helps offset the slowdown in the working-age population. (Source: NC Commerce)



Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion:

- **67%** of job seekers consider workplace diversity a key factor in employment decisions. *(Source: Glassdoor, 2014)*
- **50%** of employees want their workplace to do more to increase diversity.
- 83% of millennials are more engaged when their company promotes a diverse and inclusive culture. (Source: Deloitte Millennial Survey, 2018)




Business Impact of Inclusion:

- Highly inclusive companies see:
 - 1.4x more revenue
 - 1.7x more innovation
 - 2.3x more cash flow per employee (Source: Gartner, 2018)

IETs are an ongoing success in North Carolina All 30 IELCE providers have approved IETs

IELCE providers have approved IETs in all of the 16 Career Cluster.

797 students are enrolled in IELCE as of last Friday

1600 students enrolled in an IET statewide and 763 of them are from IELCE providers

Statewide we have all Career Clusters represented.

Key Components of IET Programs:

An Integrated Education and Training (IET) program combines adult education, workforce preparation, and job-specific skills training to equip learners for employment in high-demand industries, all within a single, cohesive program.

Integration of Three Required Activities:

- Adult Education and Literacy Activities
- Workforce Preparation Activities
- Workforce Training Activities for a specific occupation or occupational cluster

Career Pathway Alignment:

- IET programs must be part of a career pathway leading to both educational and career advancement.
- Programs must be aligned with the state's Adult Education Content Standards.

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IELCE and ELL compared

Adult ELL

- Often have life experiences, such as work or raising a family
- May have prior education in their native language
- Learning English for a specific purpose like work, daily life, or to help their children with school.

Shared

Characteristics

- Adult learners of English
- May come from diverse cultural, educational, and linguistic backgrounds
- Goal-oriented and motivated to integrate into the U.S society and workforce.

IELCE

- Enrolled in programs that Integrate English literacy and civics education with workforce preparation.
- Must have an IET to enroll in that ends with an industry recognized credential
- English Language, civics education and workforce must be taught concurrently.



IELCE Funding Formula

IELCE funding is based on this formula.

The participation and performance components are based on the last full program year's final data set. For example, funding in program year 2022-23 is based on the participation and MSG of students in the 2020-21 program year.

Performance: 20% of available funding is allocated based on the provider's share of initial NRS ESL student Measurable Skill Gains (MSGs).

> Participation: 10% of available funding is allocated based on the provider's share of participants.

IELCE Funding Formual

Base: 70% of available funding is allocated equally across providers.

30 providers participate in the IELCE grant

Transitioning to Opportunities for Growth

- Increased Enrollment: More students enrolling in IELCE/IET programs.
- Improved Completion Rates: Students successfully completing career pathways.

(Per Sandra - the number of credentials earned by CCR students increased exponentially from 206 in 22-23, to 1,495 in 23-24!)


